Document Checklist for Ozone Redline Entries

For import of air conditioning or refrigeration systems/units that operate on or contain CFCs, HCFCs and HFCs including: vehicles, caravans, motor homes, trucks, agricultural equipment, marine vessels, aircraft, refrigerators, air conditioners, ice makers, slushy machines, oil rigs, etc.

After obtaining a Customs and Border Protection Service entry number please forward all Redline entries directly to ozone@environment.gov.au

Redline release will be granted only after **ALL** documentary evidence listed below is provided.

All imports

1. VIA (Vehicle Import Approval) for all on-road use imports.

2. Customs Entry
3. Bill of Lading
4. DEGAS Certificate – use current degas forms as a guide.

5. Invoice for goods imported

Vehicles as personal effects

1. VIA (Vehicle Import Approval)
2. Customs Entry
3. Bill of Lading
4. Proof of Ownership of 12 months or more – Registration papers
Vehicles owned for less than 12 months **WILL NOT** be classified as personal effects and require all documentation as per 'All imports' above.
